REMINDERS:

- a. Before coming for your medical examination, you must lodge your visa application, either with the Australian Embassy or via eVisa systems.
- b. Applicants are advised to take their meals prior to coming over for their medical examination since food is not allowed within the premises and all the initial blood and urine tests do not require a fasting state.
- c. FOR PREGNANT Applicants please bring OB_Gyne consent prior to xray.
- d. Females within the reproductive age group are advised not to schedule their medical examination during their menstrual period. Otherwise, they will be required to come back one week after the last day of their menstruation.
- e. Applicants who have been scheduled for additional examinations must come on their designated examination date and time.

* If original passport is not available:

- a Health Examinations List (HAP letter) (or equivalent documentation from the Department that shows which health examinations are required) and a copy of your passport photo page that has been certified by the department or an AVAC.
- a Health Examinations List (HAP letter) with a photograph attached together with stamp/seal from the Department.
- Non-migrating applicants who does not have a passport or already given to Embassy:
 - Government issued ID's
 - Bureau of Internal Revenue (BIR) ID (laminated version with photo)
 - Voter's ID (laminated version with photo)
 - Driver's license
 - Social Security System (SSS) ID
 - Postal ID
 - Professional Regulations Commission (PRC) ID
 - Unified Multi-Purpose ID

*For children

- NSO birth certificate and atleast one form of identification with a photo (school ID)

E. 3 good quality photocopies (preferably in colour) of Passport/Valid ID's clearly showing photo, name and date of birth

F. Please bring black ballpen

G. Non fasting

H. Bring all medical records if available

- Old chest x-ray films not less than 3 months prior to the medical examination
- Detailed medical certificate regarding a previously-treated or currently managed clinically significant illness which should contain the following information:
 - duration and date of treatment
 - surgical procedure or medical intervention done
 - complete final diagnosis
 - outcome of treatment or treatment plans and prognosis, if available

Required Examinations	
Physical Examination, urinalysis, HIV, HBSAG, Anti-HCV, Chest x-ray (501, 502, 707, 708, 716)	

Permanent visa applicants 2-10 years old are required to undertake either a Tuberculin Skin Test (TST) OR a TB Blood Test (Interferon Gamma Release Assay or IGRA)

- **Tuberculin Skin Test (TST) requires 2 clinic visits. Second visit is between 48 and 72 hours from TST placement.**
- **The TB Blood Test (Interferon Gamma Release Assay or IGRA) will only require 1 clinic visit if results are negative.**

Chest X-ray will be required for children 10 years old and below if they have a positive TST/IGRA result or have exposure to TB Cases or a history of TB disease
